*Parent Questionnaire summary*

At the parent evening on 9 October 2025, we asked for parental feedback through a questionnaire. This contained the majority of questions that are used on Ofsted Parent View but also additional questions that are relevant and important to the school. The majority of the questions asked parents to respond using a scale, which is the same as Ofsted Parent View: Strongly Agree, Agree, Disagree, Strongly Disagree and Don't know. The Table shows a summary of the responses to these questions, the final column shows the percentage of parents who answered strongly agree or agree.

In the final section of the questionnaire there was an opportunity for parents to comment on what we are doing well and if we could make any improvements. The overwhelming feedback in this section was positive. Where parents have made suggestions, the school are considering these points and have parents for suggestions to address the points they have raised.
